The case was in the Los Angeles Superior court.

Cause(s) of action: Invasion of privacy

Plaintiff, represented by Okorie Okorocha, sought emotion distress damages only, but had no medical records or a mental health provider or expert witness, which makes this verdict truly remarkable, and no other attorney is known to have ever obtained such a high verdict.

Jury Verdict: \$1,300,000 plus a finding of fraud oppression and/or malice, which triggered the need for a punitive damage phase phase.
